



From the President's Pen

Let me take this opportunity to provide all of our members with an understanding of how our Society continues to exist. As you may know, we repeatedly ask for volunteers each year for our Gem and Mineral show held in March. And, since I have been a member, we have had a decent turnout each year of volunteers. But why the big push for volunteers for our Gem and Mineral show? Here's the basic premise of what happens with our show profits and how the club continues to exist.

Since it is time for us to renew our annual membership, all of us are aware of this fee. Now considering that we are presently 278 members strong and the membership fee is rather small, the Society would eat through these funds in no time at all. We have many expenditures, including our monthly meeting hall rental cost, a rental cost for our Lapidary Shop space (yearly about \$8000), and the rental cost for our storage trailer. There are also the rental costs for us to put on our Gem and Mineral show at the fairgrounds. Those are over \$10,000. Our other large costs include insurance (the meetings, the shop, the trailer, the field trips, the show, and even the officers are all required to be insured) and yearly dues for the state CFMS organization, to make up a majority of our costs.

We can only cover these costs by rolling all our show profits right back into the Society to pay for the above listed items. Without the show, we would have no way of continuing to exist. This is why we really push and ask time and again for show volunteers. We not only want to provide the best show in Northern California, but we also want to continue to have a great Society with a great bunch of likeminded folks.

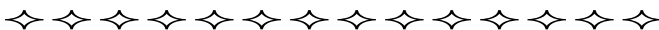
Rockhound of the Year Award – past recipient Carole Kowalik asked about the procedure for choosing Junior and Adult recipients for this award. Information was shared.

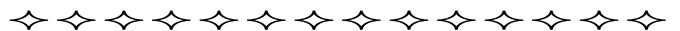

Printed in this bulletin is a renewal form to be used for renewing your RRR membership dues for 2018. Our dues are from January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2018.

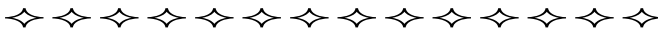

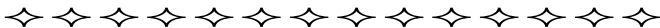

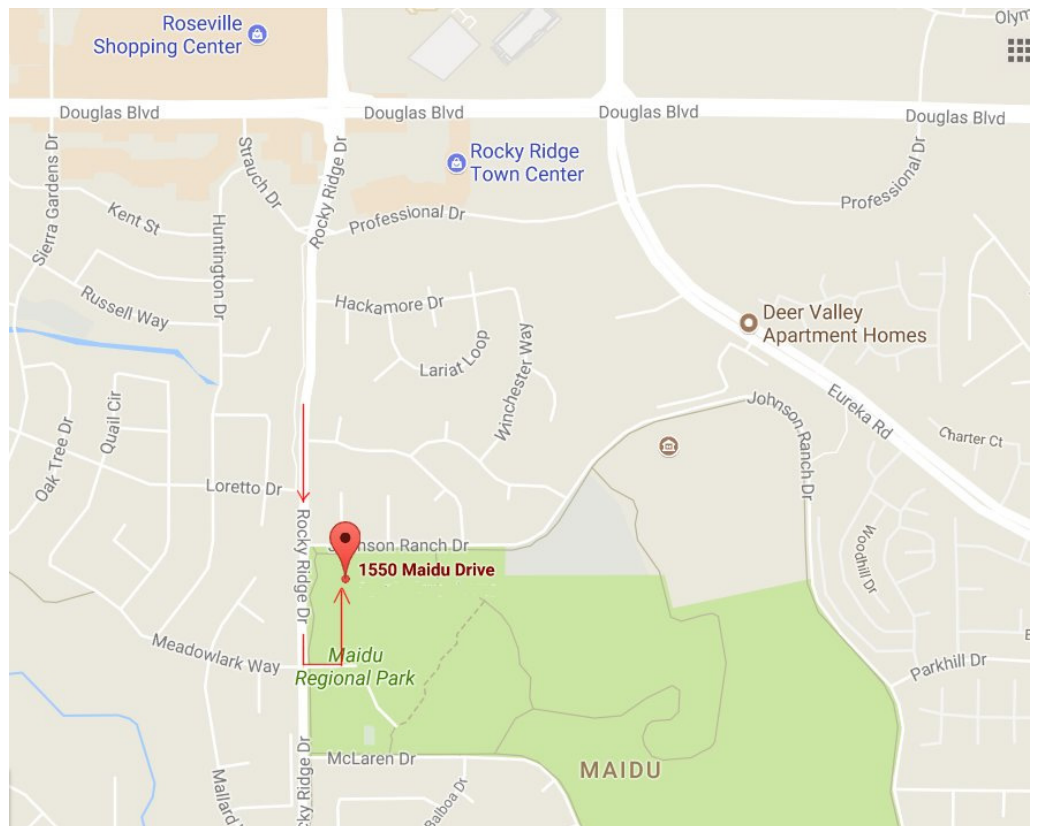
Maidu Instructions:

On September 26, the RRR President, Secretary, Treasurer, Show Chair and Silent Auction Chair met with @ The Grounds CEO David Attaway and General Manager Gabrielle Stevenson.

After an hour-long discussion at the Fairgrounds office, we put on hard hats and Gabrielle took us on a tour of the half-renovated Jones & Johnson Halls. They are looking pretty spiffy, with new lights, new ceiling drop down power cords, new heat and cooling, new paint inside and outside, new roll-up doors. The restrooms and kitchen were gutted and will be totally renovated.

Here are a few items we noted, good and bad, which RRR members will want to know:

Chairs: The new foldup chairs are black, nice-looking, sturdy and comfortable. No more wondering if your chair will collapse when you sit down!

Tables: We told them we need 300 for our show, but they seemed to think only 100 was typical for an

“event” at the Fairgrounds. Big disconnect here, which will have to be resolved.

Concrete area between Jones & Johnson Halls: This will be strictly pedestrian, no vehicles allowed. Our show vendors may hate not being able to drive into that area to unload.

Garden Room: It will be carpeted, which may be a worry for us using it as our Admission entrance at our show. Another big disconnect, since they envisioned the Garden Room as a sort of formal, pretty place. It will have to be determined how we should use it, for our educational meetings and our show.

Parking Lot C: Right now it’s dirt, but 2M dollars of renovations are under way, including grading, lights installation, and paving. It will be done by December, assuming no rain.

Parking Fees: There’s no way out of this — \$5 per vehicle per day will be charged for our show.

Lauppe Hall: It is now unusable, so our show will not have that building. We will use the extra area in Jones Hall (the stage has been removed) to compensate.

Johnson Hall: It will have ADA access to the stage there, a wheelchair lift.

What we will pay the Fairgrounds from now on: This is still up in the air. We showed them the contracts for what we pay now, for the meeting room, for the Lapidary Shop, for the rental of Jones & Johnson Halls for the show. They would not commit to any dollar amounts beyond the end of year 2017.

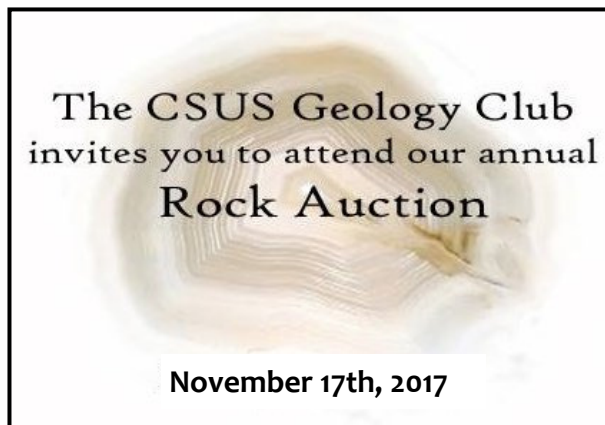
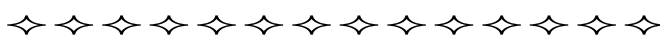
